Thinking Process	What it means	Sample Questions and Tasks
<b>Knowledge</b>	To recall information received.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What would you buy in a clothes shop?</li> <li>❖ Who will you see in the shop?</li> <li>❖ How are the clothes stored?</li> </ul>
<b>Understanding</b>	To show understanding of information by summarising or reinstating in own words.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What is a till?</li> <li>❖ Why are clothes different sizes?</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	To use previously learned information in a new situation.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What do you need to take with you when you go shopping?</li> <li>❖ How can you pay for your shopping?</li> </ul>
<b>Analysis</b>	To develop skills of inference and deduction.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Why do you need to buy new clothes?</li> <li>❖ How are the clothes made and delivered to the shop?</li> <li>❖ What would happen if the shop sold out of clothes?</li> </ul>
<b>Synthesis / Speculation</b>	To formulate a new theory, argument or summary based on informed understanding.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ If you had a shop what would you sell?</li> <li>❖ What sort of bag would you give your customer to carry the shopping home in?</li> </ul>
<b>Evaluation</b>	To judge the value of ideas or materials & articulate reasons.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What makes a good shop?</li> </ul>

Meals
Sample Questions and Tasks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What meals do we have?</li> <li>❖ What type of things do we eat at breakfast?</li> <li>❖ Why do we need to eat?</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What is your favourite meal?</li> <li>❖ What do you use to eat with?</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ If you gave a friend a surprise party what food would you buy?</li> <li>❖ Why would you choose this food?</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What else would you need to do if you were having a party? (planning guest list, invitation, venue, entertainment)</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ How do you think your friends will feel when they come home to a party?</li> <li>❖ What will the guests wear?</li> <li>❖ Will the guests bring a present?</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ What makes a good party?</li> <li>❖ How would your (imaginary) surprise party be different to a party you have been to?</li> </ul>

## Clothing and Weather

### Sample Questions and Tasks

- Who is wearing a jumper / socks etc.?
- Where would you wear a coat?
- When would you wear a T-shirt?
- Why do people wear more clothes in the cold weather?
- Why do people wear fewer clothes in the warm weather?
- What could you do if you were cold?
- What would you wear in Arthur's House (Worried Arthur)?
- What would the boy wear in "Kapita Plain"?
- Why?
- What might you wear tomorrow if it was snowing / raining / very hot? Why?
- What would you like to wear when it is very hot / cold?
- What materials would you wear in the cold weather?
- What would you put in your suitcase if you were going to a hot country?
- What would you pack if you did not know what the weather was going to be like?
- How would you know if you had the right things in your suitcase?
- Would you change anything?

### Sample Questions and Tasks

- Do snails, worms, ladybirds have legs?
- How many legs does a spider have?
- What does "antennae" mean?
- Where might you find a snail, worm, ladybird?
- Why do worms live underground?
- Why do ladybirds fly?
- Why do you think ladybirds have spots?
- Why do you think a ladybird is black and red?
- Can snails, worms, ladybirds live somewhere else?
- Can ladybirds be another colour?
- Could ladybirds have squares instead of spots?
- Would ladybirds have to live somewhere else if they had squares?
- Would the rhyme "Ladybird, ladybird" have to be different if the colour / shape changed?

- What do they eat?
- How do their feathers change?
- Why do they huddle together?
- What does huddle mean?
- What does waterproof mean?
- How are penguins different to other birds?
- How do you think the babies feel when they are left?

- How do babies attract their parents' attention?
- What type of coat would you choose to wear if you lived in a place like the penguins?
- Why would you choose that coat?
- Would you like to be a penguin?
- What are the advantages / disadvantages in being a penguin?
