



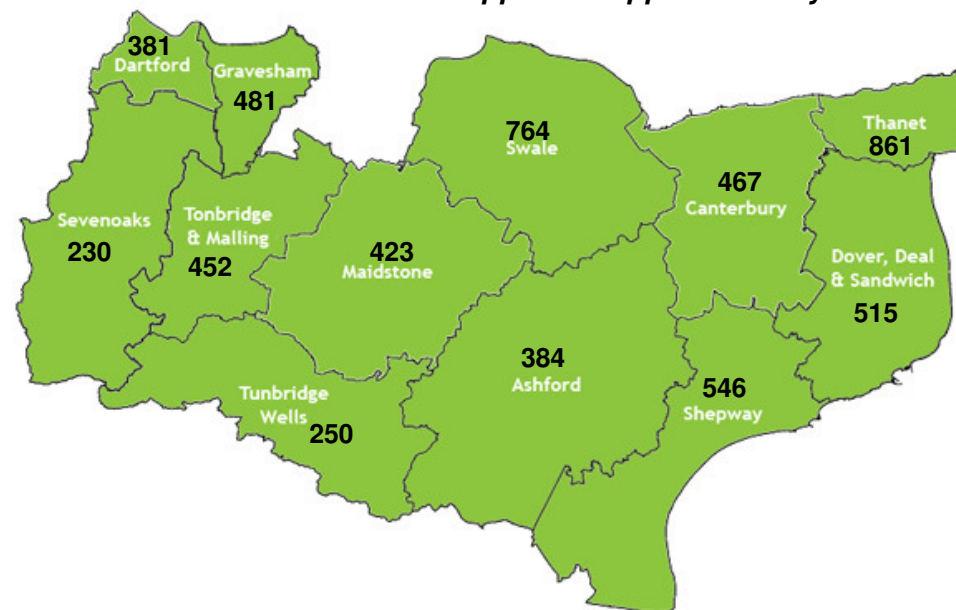
# Kent Home Access Summary Report

The Home Access campaign aimed to provide practical and financial support to low income families by providing free computers and internet to get them online, safely, at home. The main objective was to ensure that all learners have equal access to the internet outside of school hours to support their learning and achievement in addition to boosting their confidence and ICT skills. It also aimed to provide opportunities to engage parents for better involvement in their child's education.

Kent is the most successful county in the region, receiving 20% of the South East's approved applications.

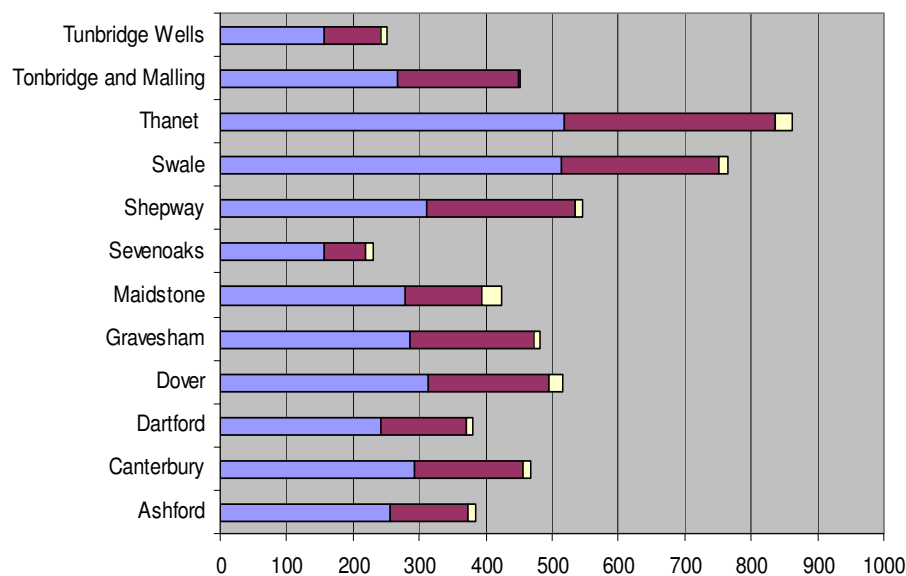
- 5,754 Home Access packages were distributed to Kent families.
- Kent received a significantly higher number of grants than neighbouring counties, 2,077 more than Hampshire and 4,111 more than Oxfordshire.
- 38% of children who are eligible for free school meals benefited from the scheme.
