

## Kent Teenage Pregnancy Partnership Action Plan 2006-2009

This plan details the actions of the Kent Teenage Pregnancy Strategy. It has been written within the framework created by the Next Steps guidance with some additional sections as directed by the Self-assessment toolkit. It is a rolling action plan for the next 2 years and the dataset is reviewed 3 monthly by the strategic Partnership Board.

The plan cross-references the Every Child Matters outcomes.

Most actions have a performance indicator and the data derived in 2007 has provided some baseline data with which to measure future performance.
