



## Working with Children Facing Loss and Bereavement

<b>Who for</b>	Social Workers with at least 2-year's post qualifying experience
<b>Aims and Objectives</b>	Many of the children known to Social Services have been affected by multiple loss experience. This has often had a profound impact on their behaviour and emotional development. This course aims to help workers identify children, young people and families who are at risk of a complicated reaction. It offers the opportunity to develop skills that promote resilience in complex families.
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	<p>To understand the impact of loss and bereavement on children and young people, to familiarise ourselves with contemporary theoretical frameworks to aid understanding of the grief process, to develop practical skills to support families affected by complex experience of loss, to understand and be able to promote resilience in children and their families.</p> <p>Please note: This course will not necessarily involve participants engaging with their personal understanding/experience of loss to enhance learning. Therefore it is unsuitable for anyone who is actively grieving.</p>
